We were comfortable wearing masks this winter, and keeping distance while meditating. So far, we have been happy holding spring/summer Meetings outside in the Pear grove with blue skies and breezes. Should we start wearing masks again at some point? We are comfortable having snacks now after rise of Meeting, but not potlucks. Things could change at any time.

**CHILDCARE:** We have the "Nest" we created for childcare in a room outside the Meeting building, but we haven't had any children recently.

**FOOD PANTRY:** Pam reminded us that everyone ought to have a food pantry for themselves and needy neighbors in case a food strike, pandemic or a food system break-down. And, at any time, individual families can be in trouble too.


